



New clarification from the MDDEFP on the Regulation respecting the recovery and reclamation of products by enterprises effective since July 1st, 2013 regarding the original equipment manufacturer products (OEM)

Following a mistake in the Regulation's drafting, MDDEFP has made an important clarification to the Regulation in regards to oils used for transformers. Please note that transformer oils are not subject to this regulation. Members have been notified that they no longer have to pay remittance on such oils as of July 1st 2013, and that companies who already completed their remittance will be reimbursed.

We also notified Members that, however, because these oils are not regulated, Collectors will no longer be allowed subsidies from SOGHU for their collections which could influence agreements with companies who have collection needs for these oils.

We hereby notify you that **transformer oils** are no longer eligible for SOGHU subsidies as of **October 15th 2013**.

Moreover, the Jig-A-Loo company has made the ministry recognize that their products do not meet the regulation's criteria. Thus, during the characterization of aerosols, all Jig-A-Loo products will be subtracted from total collected weights and should be reimbursed to SOGHU by the Collector. It is therefore the Collector's responsibility to notify the Generators that these products are not to be disposed of in SOGHU's aerosol recipients.
